Grammar Box

Adverbs are words that describe how someone does something. They are usually made by adding *-ly*. If the word ends with *-y*, change the *y* to an *i* before adding *-ly*.

cheerful → cheerfully
He sang cheerfully.

happy → happily
She danced happily.

Culture Box

To talk about a whole family, use “the” and the last name with -s.
Use -es if the family’s name ends in s or z.

The Smith family = The Smiths
The Martin family = The Martins

The Jones family = The Joneses
The Ruiz family = The Ruizes
